USES 115 Gallons of Water Daily



Water use quickly adds up.

An average Palo Alto household uses about 115 gallons per person per day. Nearly 43% of your home water use goes to four fixtures in the home: toilets, clothes washers, showers and faucets. You can reduce water use by being more efficient in how you use these fixtures.

The most obvious is to find and stop leaks. A typical toilet or faucet leak can waste over

50 gallons of water per day. Bigger leaks waste even more.

Also, you can save a lot of water in your yard. Yard irrigation is the single largest water user at your home. Consider using our landscape rebates to help turn your water-guzzling lawns into beautiful, Bay Friendly landscapes.

WATER WISE HOUSE CALL

Sign up for a FREE Water Wise House Call, and we'll send a trained technician to your home or apartment to evaluate the efficiency of your indoor and outdoor water use. HIGH EFFICIENCY TOILET REBATE PROGRAM

Receive up to \$125 for installing High Efficiency Toilets (HET) that use 1.28 gallons per flush (gpf) or less. **Pre-approval is required** before purchasing your new HET, and you must be replacing an existing 3.5 gpf or greater toilet. With the rebate and your lower water bill, the cost of installing a new toilet will pay back in only a few months. For more information, call (877) 874-8479.

HIGH EFFICIENCY CLOTHES WASHER REBATE PROGRAM

Get a rebate of \$125 or \$200 for purchasing a new high efficiency clothes washer that not only saves water, but also energy. On average, a typical household will save 6,450 gallons of water, \$100 in energy costs, and \$54 in detergent costs each year by installing a qualifying high efficiency clothes washer.
