Prior to proceeding with construction on the renovation of the historic building housing the College Terrace Library and Child Care Center in late October, a public meeting is scheduled to present information on the project. The improvements will upgrade the building's seismic reinforcement, electrical, heating and air conditioning systems, enhance accessibility, include painting and involve renovation of Mayfield Park that surrounds the library. The project was reviewed and supported by the Historic Resources Board and the Architectural Review Board, and received final approval by the Director of Planning on February 5, 2009. Mayfield Park, surrounding the library, will also be closed during the construction period. The park renovation includes the replacement of the irrigation system, removal and replacement of selected trees and shrubs, new site furnishings, and accessibility compliance work.

Certain trees have been identified for removal because they are in conflict with the building renovation and subsurface drainage work. Their removal was included in the Historic Review Board process. These five trees had notices posted on them on September 28, 2009, to begin their minimum 14-day notice period before removal. Additional trees within Mayfield Park and not related to the building rehabilitation have been identified as potential candidates for removal and replacement and will be discussed at the public meeting for further review.

Lastly, the through-way on Wellesley Street near the library will be closed to the public during construction for safety reasons.
