












Leverage technology to integrate the Library into the lives of community members.



Digital Literacy Programs


Improved awareness and access to, emerging technologies.

- 3D Design Coach sessions
- Teen volunteers taught the public to create virtual models.
- Virtual Reality demonstrations
- Robotic Programs:
 - 20 classes
 - 4 series
 - 446 students & parents



Cybersecurity Education

Developed a cybersecurity education program for youth based on the popular computer game Minecraft. Program reached 2,100 teens and 7 libraries in the Bay Area.





Capital ImprovementMaster Plan Projects

 Create a special "digital" space where the Library can provide information literacy classes, robotic programs, and virtual reality demonstrations.

Education & Learning

- Train PAUSD teachers on using library databases and other educational resources.
- Introduce Brainfuse to parent and student groups



Community Partnerships

 Work with PAUSD to engage students with summer learning, recreation and volunteering opportunities

Technology

- Turn occasional services into ongoing services, and hold more occasional services.
- Hold technology lectures, discussions, more coding workshops



Marketing and Publicity

- Create several marketing and publicity staff work groups to effectively market the library's services and programs
- Share monthly director reports with City Council

Revenue Generation

 Seek out new opportunities for revenue generation to contribute to the fiscal sustainability of the Library



Eliminate Late Fines

- LAC passed a motion in June 2019 to recommend banning fines on policy terms
- Neighboring libraries that have eliminated fines: San Francisco, Mountain View, San Mateo County

Disband LAC until there's a need for more advocacy

- No current or recent major issues require oversight
- Allow staff to use time to provide more library services to the community
