Seconded by Commissioner Bernardo. AYES: unanimous. **AGENDA CHANGES, REQUESTS, and DELETIONS:** None **BUSINESS** 1. DISCUSSION REGARDING BUDGET CUTS TO PUBLIC SAFETY IN RESPECT TO COLLECTING DEMOGRAPHIC DATA Chief Dennis Burns summarized the proposed positions that are scheduled to be cut effective July 1, 2010 for next fiscal year (2010-2011). He explained that the Finance Committee was going to make the recommendation to keep all sworn positions on the list but to continue with the proposed elimination of

non-sworn positions such as the crime analyst position which is responsible for analyzing and reporting

on the collected demographic data. Because of this cut, the department will no longer be collecting

demographic data. He further explained that past years cuts have made the department more generalized even though the population is increasing in the city making it impossible for another area of the department to take on this task. He further explained that the current initiatives and video taping all stops from police cars will continue to help the department achieve its goals of fairness.

The commissioners asked questions. Certain data will continue to be collected but not on all contacts made by officers as was done before. The change in collecting data will occur July 1st. The department will keep all the data collected from past years.

The commissioners discussed the pros and cons of this recommendation. The collected data holds the city accountable as a form of insurance for the public. It was the impression of Chief Burns that the Police Auditor would support keeping the position and continuing with data collection but he is removed from the situation of the budget problems. Officers also carry camera's on their tasers, so there are other ways to keep the officers accountable as well as their early detection program which allows for intervention with officers who begin to show a pattern of behavior undesirable to the department.

Mr. John Abraham, a Palo Alto resident presented a binder of all the reports since the collection began. He spoke about the need to continue with the collection, analysis and reporting of the data in spotting trends. He asked the commissioners to recommend to City Council that the data collection continue.

 The commissioners continued discussing their concerns. There was support for Mr. Abraham's recommendation because it could potentially save the city money, and continue to be a source of insurance for the residents of Palo Alto in keeping with the goal of transparency. There was concern expressed that by keeping this position, it might take an officer off the street, which was reason enough not to support the recommendation to reinstate the position.

Commissioner Bernardo made a motion that the HRC recommends to the City Council that the Crime Analyst Position in the PAPD be reinstated if doing so would not require a compensatory reduction elsewhere in the department. We make this recommendation in support of retaining an element of transparency and enabling analysis of patterns and trends. 2nd by Commissioner Bacchetti, AYES: Unanimous.

Mr. Hermann suggested to the commissioners that they email their recommendation to City Council and or present it in person at a future City Council meeting.

2. DISCUSSION REGARDING PROCEDURE TO ESTABLISH FY 2011-2012 HUMAN SERVICES RESOURCE ALLOCATION PROCESS (HSRAP) "PRIORITY OF NEEDS"

Minka Van der Zwaag, Office of Human Services Manager asked for input from HRC on how to improve the HSRAP process by working on a subcommittee with her to review and refine the priority setting and proposal review criteria. She shared some ideas such as inviting experts that are not recipients to come and give presentations about the general needs and trends in their field.

The commissioners discussed her idea and shared their support for it. Commissioners Ezran and Bacchetti volunteered to work on the committee and report back to the HRC at the next meeting.

3. UPDATE ON WORLD MUSIC DAY

Commissioner Ezran reminded everyone that the event is this Sunday, June 20th. This year there is more participation, more variety of music, and longer hours for the event. Publicity for this year's event has increased as well as the number of visitors to the website. He would like to setup an organization committee to share the workload for future events.

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4. UPDATE ON DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION PROJECT

Commissioner Bacchetti opened a discussion of ways for the HRC to be proactive regarding its goal. He sketched 4 possible ways.

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- 1. Sponsoring a panel discussion, focus groups, a study session, etc. to expand community discussion of the topic and develop shared meanings of the terms "diversity" and "inclusion" and what they might ideally mean for Palo Alto.
- 2. Recognize exemplary programs by developing a set of criteria, build an application process and method of assessing applications, and award certificates to those organizations and agencies that meet

the criteria.

- 3. Use social media to generate a time-limited, online discussion to draw others into the conversation, with goals similar to those for the panel idea.
- 4. Develop a special interest in those among the 41 Developmental Assets that pertain to diversity and inclusion, e.g., assets # 27, 34, and 41.

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The Commission agreed to start working on #1 and noted that one or more of the others might be approached later on, depending on the results for #1. Commissioners Savage and Ezran will work with Commissioner Bacchetti to flesh out the idea.

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5. UPDATE ON CONSIDERATION OF ADDING STUDENT MEMBER TO HRC

Commissioner Bacchetti reported on his exploratory discussion with Adam Howard, Supervisor of Recreation Programs for Youth and Teens about a relationship between the HRC and the Palo Alto Youth Council. The PAYC meets weekly when school is in session, focuses on events, and aims to make Palo Alto more youth friendly. Mr. Howard thought that the PAYC would welcome working with the HRC and suggested that the HRC write to the PAYC president, Chirag Krishna, suggesting such a relationship.

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Commissioner Bacchetti made a motion that the HRC express its interest in a working relationship with the PAYC and select on member and one alternate to represent the Commission in this role. 2nd by Commissioner Ezran, AYES: Unanimous.

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Commissioner Bacchetti was asked to write a letter. Follow up discussion will occur when new members are seated on the HRC.
