Santa Clara County Director of Public Health Update from March 17

- The virus continues to mutate and change, and the community should continue masking, testing, and get vaccinated and boosted to keep the community safe and healthy.
- A variety of Omicron that spreads more easily, B2 sub-lineage, was detected in the wastewater and is increasing in prevalence in the Bay Area, notably in Palo Alto.
- It does not seem to be increasing COVID-19 case counts. County health officials are watching this carefully.


