New State Law: Draft Military Equipment Use Policy & Next Steps



- A new law, Assembly Bill 481, went into effect on January 1, 2022, and is designed to increase community awareness surrounding a police agency's possession and use of certain types of equipment. State law requires the City Council to provide both authorization and oversight of its use.
- The Palo Alto Police Department's proposed policy is posted online and public input can be shared through a dedicated input form.
- The City Council will be considering the proposed policy no later than November 1 of this year.

CIVIC CENTER PLAZA WATERPROOFING PROJECT

- The Civic Center Plaza's waterproofing repair project is scheduled to start this week on May 4 and is expected to last two months.
