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Should the police have all the military weapons and the guns while our city council debates further limiting our Second Amendment rights?

Should the city council shut their eyes to the extraordinarily violent police culture in this country?

Last year, 2022, per The Guardian and the Washington Post police across this country killed nearly 1200 hundred people -an average of 3 people a day.

Given the extraordinary disproportionate extrajudicial executions of African Americans every year by the police — should the city council carve out an exception allowing African Americans to be armed in all of the same public and private locations that police are allowed to carry guns? Arguably arming African Americans in the same private and public spaces council proposes -to allow police and retired police to be armed- would substantially mitigate- act to eliminate the extrajudicial (without trial or due process) execution of African Americans in these spaces.

For many Black Americans, this dream has been for a true reckoning for the injustice done to our community since Europeans enslaved our ancestors, forced them into ships, made them work, and treated them less than human....for centuries. In a country governed by the rule of law, that type of injustice is addressed. Sadly, the injustice against Black Americans has yet to be addressed fully.

California Democrats are working to change that with a bill to create a task force to study and develop reparations proposals that was authored by then Assemblymember Shirley Weber, passed by both houses of the Democratic-controlled Legislature, and signed by Democratic Governor Gavin Newsom in September of 2020. By law, the Task Force must submit a report with recommendations to the Legislature by Jun 1, 2023.

As Chair of the California Democratic Party Black Caucus, I want to make sure that as many Democrats as possible understand what is going on with regard to reparations and learn how they can make sure that reparations are delivered. While reparations cannot erase hundreds of years of enslavement, Jim Crow, racial segregation, lynching, underinvestment in communities, and more, it is one way we address injustice in a country ruled by law. Reparations will also go far in helping many Black Americans to realize their deferred dreams.

The CADEM Black Caucus is excited to partner with the California Democratic Party and others to organize regional reparations strategy sessions. We will discuss the work of the Reparations Task Force, their recommendations, and what you can do to help make their recommendations real. **The first session will be in Riverside, California on April 1st. We will have another session during our Convention in Los Angeles at the end of May, followed by one in Oakland in June, Sacramento in July, and San Diego in August.**

Agreed!

The new Sheriff has many issues he has not been held to answer for, therefore increasing the risk of him running amuck at taxpayers expense and unknown told number of lives which will be affected by poor leadership as demonstrated from his command at 3 agencies (LASD, MPD, PAPD).

With his strong support from former Sheriff Laurie Smith and as evident recently he told the Mercury News, he will not change the current command structure.

Rare that this happens and a practice done within the Los Angeles Sheriff Office where corruption, civil rights violations continue to plague that department, where Bob Jonsen started his career and left abruptly as a LA Sheriff Commander.

Interesting we find his comments to the Mercury News absurd because we have personal knowledge that the former Sheriff Laurie Smith has been Bob Jonsen's mentor and was hand picked by Laurie Smith to run for Sheriff so that he would keep her policies and command structure in place. And that's exactly what he is doing.

Her command structure is of course not resistant to change because they have someone now in place to carry on the legacy of her leadership.

Spoken like a true LA Sheriff Commander who has proven true to not be held accountable for the 2013 Civil Rights violations under his command, per a DOJ report, he has all of the politicians in Santa Clara County fooled.

Jonsen says..

"I think the organization is ready for change. They're all pretty much in alignment with the direction I want to head the organization. If I felt there was going to be resistance to the change and the direction I want to head, I would absolutely change commanders".

And our response to Anna Eschoo ridiculous comment..

"We're incredibly fortunate that he has chosen a lifetime, a career, to live out these values. He is the son of a police officer, he is the great nephew of a former Santa Clara County Sheriff, and like them, he has heeded the call to serve".

Did Anna Eschoo vet Bob Jonsen's background? Apparently not. When anyone speaks about law enforcement leaders, they should know who they are speaking of! We know his Father from SFPD did not serve honorably. We know that his great uncle Sheriff Sweigart was brought up on charges of embezzlement and worse, we know Bob Jonsen's own son, Travis R. Jonsen, who was in a deputy gang was shot off duty by another deputy gang member over tampering of his gang tattoo. The investigation was covered up as an accidental shooting. LASD Sheriff sources confirmed to Journalists who the deputy shot was and that is how we obtained the name.

Our point is, Bob Jonsen has a storied past. Bob Jonsen was the commander in LA (Antelope Valley) when the DOJ concluded that Civil Rights violations occurred which included unlawful search/seizures, racial profiling, etc against African Americans. Bob Jonsen left the LASD and became Chief in Menlo Park, therefore avoiding the whole issue of accountability for what happened under his command in LA.

The fact exist that Bob Jonsen is who we believe to be a bad actor in law enforcement and comes from a family who proves no better.

And here, the politicians in Santa Clara County refuses to acknowledge and listen that they should be monitoring Bob Jonsen's activities based on the amount of information out there that his leadership may be a liability for the future of the SCC Sheriff Office.

There are ongoing investigations involving Bob Jonsen with DOJ, LA OIG, FBI, etc and people need to be concerned. The purpose of those investigations is to determine what happened when Bob Jonsen shot a black teenager in 1990, what happened when Bob Jonsen surrounded himself with Deputy Gang members and perhaps involved himself with other alleged criminal circumstances, which has led to the repeated poor leadership and decisions he has made, affecting the black/brown communities from LA to Palo Alto.

Hopefully he will not get away with it here, but all our eyes are on him and he will be exposed more and more to the point if necessary public outcry, recall and with confirmed evidence, potentially criminal charges.

Nobody outside our group has done ANY investigation as to Bob Jonsen's background. Nobody has looked into any of the allegations except our group of

experienced community members who know how to separate fact and fiction. Members of our group has reported the numerous allegations for the said agencies to investigate.

We have reached out to other community advocates who have reviewed several sources, information, etc about the allegations and are appalled. Anyone else who is not, has refused or has intentionally ignored to listen to what is being brought forth.

We do not need the problems of LA here. We all know that once you open that door, its hard to get rid of. Unless you open your eyes and that of an oversight committee, you will be complicit in any future problems that the SCC Sheriff Office may be plagued with.

Dear Commissioners,

My name is Melinda Velasco and I am writing on behalf of *El Dorado County Citizens for Human Rights*. The El Dorado County Human Rights Commission faces an immediate threat of being disbanded by a divided Board of Supervisors, who voted 3-2 on January 24, 2023 to direct County staff to return "within 60 days with an item to disband the Human Rights Commission."

We are asking for your support to reverse this unfounded decision, which is expected to return to the Board on March 7th or 14th. On February 20, 2023 the Sacramento Bee's editorial board wrote,

"Three of the five members of the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors want to disband the county's Human Rights Commission, which was formed in 2018 after a series of racial incidents. But if anything, their eagerness to walk away from the project shows why the commission is so needed. ... We hope they'll think again before abandoning an effort that could be better organized but shouldn't be jettisoned because it's too difficult and upsetting."

As the Sacramento Bee article noted, none of the three Supervisors who voted to disband the Human Rights Commission responded to messages for comment. Nor did those Supervisors justify their vote with any evidence to support disbanding the commission. Those disapproving Supervisors are George Turnboo (District II), Wendy Thomas (District III and current Board Chair), and Lori Parlin (District IV).

In addition, after a Human Rights Commissioner expressed disagreement with the Board's decision and suggested Supervisors reflect on implicit bias training, two Supervisors decided to propose removing implicit bias training for all county Committees, Commissions and Boards. Supervisors will decide on this soon. We believe our current Board would benefit from guidance and recommendations from other counties, and we hope you might be able to help.

You can support the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors and the County Human Rights Commission by sharing stories of your successful commission, and your partnership in achieving those human rights accomplishments. What makes your commission effective, for example? What would you recommend to a Board of Supervisors who has challenges seeing the value of a strategically integrated Human Rights Commission?

We urgently request that you write an email to each Supervisor listed below, with a copy to the Clerk of the Board, detailing why the Board should maintain its Human Rights Commission.

We also ask you to consider speaking to the Board. Unfortunately, removal of the Human Rights Commission is not yet on the Board of Supervisors Meeting Calendar, but it has been roughly scheduled for March 14. I will email you once more with additional information a week before the Board of Supervisors meeting. If you can speak at the meeting via Zoom, you will have three minutes to individually address the Board, or up to five minutes if you are affiliated with a group.

In addition, if you are able to arrange a real conversation with one or two Board members between now and the March meeting, that will likely have a powerful impact on the decision.

The locator is part of the CDC Increasing Community Access to Testing (ICATT) program, which provides access to COVID-19 testing, focusing on communities at a greater risk of being impacted by the pandemic, and those who do not have health insurance.

Free Virtual COVID-19 Healthcare Visit for Ages 12 and Up: The California Department of Public Health provides services to connect any uninsured individual in California who tests positive for COVID-19 and has symptoms to a free consultation with a Sesame healthcare provider, as well as free drug therapy if clinically eligible. All providers have access to a translation service. To schedule an appointment, visit <https://sesamecare.com/covidca>.

Free At-Home COVID-19 Test Kits: Every U.S. household is eligible to order another round of free at-home COVID-19 test kits from the federal government (<https://www.covid.gov/tests>). The order includes four boxes (eight test kits). If you need help placing an order, call 800-232-0233.

Relief for Overdue Energy Bills: Over the next several weeks, customers with past due balances will receive a credit on their energy bill to help reduce debt accrued between March 4, 2020 and December 31, 2021. This credit is known as the California Arrearage Payment Program (CAPP) and will be applied to all parts of your energy bill where money is owed (i.e., PG&E, San José Clean Energy, and gas charges). This is the second round of CAPP credits to be distributed to San José customers. Read more about CAPP on the state's website at www.csd.ca.gov/CAPP. If you receive a CAPP credit and still owe money on your energy bill, you should make a plan to pay off your debt. The TNR method breaks the breeding cycle and allows cats to live their natural life in their home territory while decreasing the number of unwanted kittens entering the shelter. The phrase *kol yisrael arevim zeh bazeh* (Talmud, Shavuot 39a), meaning all of Israel are responsible for each other, is the basis of the notion of communal responsibility in Jewish law.

Simply by virtue of being a Jew one is responsible for the well-being of other Jews.

As an organization grounded in Jewish values, one of the key pillars of our work is focused on the well being of the Jewish people here, in Israel, and around the world. The unprecedented protests in Israel, centered on the proposed overhaul of the judiciary, brings the attention of all of us to this moment.

For a broader overview of what is going on in Israel, **this recent New York Times** article is a good place to start. The poll by the Jewish People Policy Institute shows that 44% support, and 41% oppose the changes, deeply dividing the country. The supporters of the proposed changes believe there is a need for greater parity between elected lawmakers and an unelected judiciary. Those opposed to the changes believe that the proposals would remove essential checks and balances, give too much power to the government, and endanger minority rights.

At the beginning of this month, Matti Friedman, Yossi Klein-Halevi, and Daniel Gordis **issued an open letter** to North American Jews calling for engagement. Additional calls for engagement on the issue of Israel's proposed judiciary changes are coming from major denominations (Reform, Conservative and Reconstructionist) and national Jewish institutions (e.g. National Council of Jewish Women, Israel Policy Forum, Shalom Hartman Institute). They have joined together to offer a webinar **this Thursday, February 16 at 11 am PT** on this consequential moment and the role of North American Jews in securing Israel's future.

In the South Bay, our Israeli family has been deeply engaged on this issue and is asking for American Jews to get informed and if so moved, to get engaged. Galit Lipsitz Goldenthal, an Israeli ex-pat involved in several local Jewish institutions, including the JCRC, says,

"I used to believe that those who do not live in Israel cannot truly understand it and should not express opinions on it, neither from the right nor from the left. As I see my homeland changing and drifting further away from basic democratic principles, I am afraid for it. We now find ourselves at a point where Israel is on the brink of passing laws that will nullify judicial independence thus losing its only check and balance against any government legislation and we are alone. This time let me be loud and clear: we need the support of anyone who embraces the right for a Jewish Democratic state to exist in the land of Israel. Please listen, learn and speak up for it. There is no other state of Israel."

Maya Tripp, Israeli and professional in the local Jewish community shares:

"Now, more than ever, I'd like to invite you to look at Israel through loving eyes. Many of you have a piece of you in Israel, and see it as a place with special meaning. Educate yourself, think about the future of Israel and what you can do now to continue to be proud of the place and its people in the future, and speak up. Don't be silent when Israel is going through an extreme change. Tomorrow might be too late."

Many of those active in the Israeli community in the Bay Area are working to organize a collective response through **unxeptable.org**.

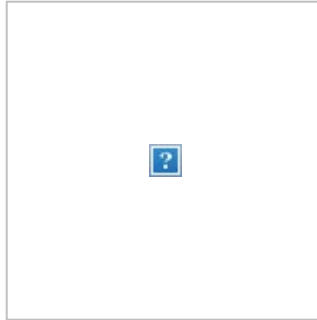

Man who died after police used Taser had warned of heart issue, video shows

Police officers in Raleigh, N.C., repeatedly used a Taser on 32-year-old Darryl "Tyree" Williams during an arrest on Jan. 17, 2023. Williams died shortly after. (Video: Raleigh Police Department)

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A North Carolina man who died about an hour after police repeatedly used a Taser on him had told officers that he had heart problems before he lost consciousness, according to footage of police surveillance and body cameras.

Darryl Tyree Williams, 32, died on Jan. 17, shortly after he fled an arrest for alleged drug possession and was stunned at least three times by officers with the Raleigh Police Department. Six officers have been placed on administrative leave amid an internal investigation and a separate inquiry from the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation.

Police on Friday night released a [roughly 12-minute edited compilation](#) of footage, which included text from authorities describing the fatal incident but not a cause of death. The edited footage of body cameras, dashboard cameras and surveillance video was released to the public more than three weeks after the death of Williams, who was Black, and two days after a judge authorized its release. Williams's family viewed the footage before it was publicly released, according to police.

The release of the footage caused Williams's family and activists to demand accountability for a death they say was caused by racial profiling and violent use of force at a time when there has been a series of high-profile police killings of Black men to start the year. After Raleigh officers had used a Taser on Williams during the arrest, the man is heard telling police that he was concerned about what the repeated use of the stun gun could mean for his heart, according to video. "I've got heart problems," Williams told officers. "Please! Please!" Despite the repeated pleas from Williams, who was not armed, officers used a Taser for a third time moments later, causing him to again shriek in pain, video shows. About a minute later, the video shows that he appears to lose consciousness. When police and EMS personnel failed to resuscitate the unresponsive man after he showed no signs of a pulse, Williams was transported to a hospital, where he died about an hour later, according to authorities.

A [preliminary report](#) of the incident released by police on Jan. 23 explained how Raleigh officers were conducting "proactive patrols" of areas that authorities say have "a history of repeat calls for service for drugs, weapons, and other criminal violations." But Sonya Williams, the man's mother, told The Washington Post that Raleigh police racially profiled her son and "didn't respect him at all as a human being." "That was my baby and he did not deserve to die that way," she said. Kerwin Pittman, a Raleigh activist working with Williams's family, echoed the sentiment to The Post: "For law enforcement to continue to Tase him after he clearly states that he has heart problems is extremely egregious." Julia Milstead, a spokesperson for the City of Raleigh and the police department, declined to comment to The Post. Angie Grube, a spokesperson with the North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation, told The Post that the investigation is ongoing and offered no further comment.

The public release of video capturing Williams's fatal encounter with law enforcement came two weeks after Memphis police released footage showing officers beating Tyre [Nichols](#), a 29-year-old Black man, as he screamed repeatedly for his mother on Jan. 7. At least five former Memphis officers, all of whom are Black, face second-degree murder and other charges related to Nichols, who died Jan. 10. A [sixth officer, who is White, was fired last week](#), and prosecutors said they are considering charges against him.

The Raleigh incident is also similar to the recent death of 31-year-old [Keenan Anderson](#), a cousin of Black Lives Matter co-founder Patrisse Cullors. Anderson died hours after Los Angeles police used a Taser on him [six times in 42 seconds](#) and restrained him in the middle of the street following a traffic accident on Jan. 3. Anderson died of cardiac arrest about 4½ hours after the use of force. [*BLM co-founder's cousin dies after police repeatedly use Taser, video shows*](#)

In Raleigh, at about 2 a.m. on Jan. 17, police were conducting "proactive patrols" in a parking lot more than a mile outside of downtown, according to police. When officers approached Williams as he sat in the driver's seat of his car, they told him that they were "checking on people," according to video. Police say they saw marijuana and an open container of alcohol in the car and asked Williams and an unidentified passenger to step out of the vehicle.

"We're not doing nothing," Williams said, according to video. While searching Williams's vehicle, police say they found a folded dollar bill that appeared to contain "a white powdery substance." Upon seeing this, police proceeded to arrest Williams, even though an officer did not tell him why, video shows. Pittman argued to The Post that police found a trace amount of white substance and that video shows that officers "couldn't see what it was." When police ordered Williams to put his hands behind his back and to get on the ground, he resisted authorities' efforts to detain him. As he appears to flee, an officer is heard on video saying, "Stop or you'll get Tased." That's when an officer deployed a Taser and Williams appears to fall to the ground, video shows. Police said in the preliminary report that Williams "lost his balance and fell forward to the ground."

After Williams was struck with the Taser in "drive stun" mode, which is when the stun gun is placed directly against a person's body, an officer is heard saying to him that he would get stunned again if he didn't stay put. Moments later, Williams mentions his heart problems to police. His mother told The Post that heart problems run in the family and that her son told her of previous chest pains. She said his father, also named Darryl, died of heart problems. Soon after police used a Taser despite the warning about his heart, the handcuffed man appeared to lose consciousness. "Is he still good?" an officer is heard asking his colleague, according to video. "Is he breathing?" another officer says. "I don't feel a pulse." An officer then addresses the unresponsive Williams: "Hey, c'mon, wake up."

Police said in the preliminary report that officers administered CPR and checked his pulse and breathing. After EMS personnel arrived, Williams was transferred to a hospital, police said. He was pronounced dead at 3:01 a.m.

While Raleigh Police Chief Estella Patterson sought the release of the video footage from a Wake County Superior Court judge, as is [required by state law](#), family members and advocates told The Post that the edited footage left out how Williams allegedly was lying handcuffed on the ground for roughly 20 minutes before EMS personnel arrived. "He was already dead by then," Sonya Williams, 57, told The Post, urging police to release all of the footage. It's unclear whether police will release the entirety of the footage. Williams's mother remembered him as "a loving person who got along with everybody" and enjoyed his job as an assistant manager at Sonic. The man she referred to as "Boo Boo" loved to travel and planned on a trip to Hawaii for his 33rd birthday on May 26, she said. Sonya Williams, of Wendell, N.C., suggested to The Post that legal action was possible against

police in the coming weeks. While she acknowledged she received some closure in watching the footage, she's still figuring out what her life is going to look like without her firstborn. "They took something that was very special to me," she said.

Taser death settlement costs county \$4.5 mil

San Mateo County has agreed to pay \$4.5 million to the mother and daughter of a man who died after being tasered by sheriff's deputies.

It's likely the biggest law enforcement-related settlement in San Mateo County history, county spokeswoman Michelle Durand said.

Chinedu Okobi, 36, died on Oct. 3, 2018, on El Camino Real in Millbrae. Police initially said he was having a mental health crisis and running in and out of traffic. They also said he assaulted Deputy Joshua Wang when the officer tried to stop him. Video of the incident shows that Okobi was walking on a sidewalk and crossed the street outside of a crosswalk and that he punched Wang after initially being Tasered.

He was then taken into custody by five officers using Tasers, pepper spray and batons.

An autopsy found Okobi died of "cardiac arrest following physical exertion, physical restraint, and recent electro-muscular disruption autopsy." District Attorney Steve Wagstaffe declined to prosecute the five officers. An internal investigation found that their actions were within the current policy. After his death, Okobi's family called for a moratorium on Taser use in the county.

Tasers still in use

Then-Sheriff Carlos Bolanos declined to stop using Tasers, but instead asked the county board of supervisors to help pay for replacing the stun guns that were about 15 years old. Policies around Tasers also changed, limiting how long one could be deployed for and when they can be used.

Okobi's family said that Okobi was walking down the street "as people do."

Officers "dramatically escalated a situation that didn't even need to be a situation," Okobi's sister, Ebele Okobi, said in a statement.

The money will go to Okobi's mother, Maureen Okobi, and the mother of his daughter, Mi'Trease Johnson, until his daughter turns 18.

The money will be paid out in lump sum payments every five years, in gradually increasing amounts.

The final payment would be \$250,000 on Aug. 27, 2069, according to the settlement agreement.

Insurance providers will pay for the county, Durand said.

The settlement was signed in September 2022 but wasn't public until a report yesterday by the San Francisco Standard. Okobi was one of three men to die in San Mateo County in 2018 after being hit with a police taser during a mental health crisis.

Warren Ragudo died in Daly City on Jan. 16, 2018, and Ramzi Saad died in Redwood City on Aug. 13, 2019.

No officers were charged in relation to those incidents.

Other settlements

The Okobi settlement was just one of three sheriff's office-related lawsuits the county settled last year.

It paid \$750,000 to Odette Riegman of Woodside, who was arrested for a DUI while having a nearly fatal medical emergency in a Canada College parking lot.

The county also paid out \$600,000 to David Gusman who was tasered in the face by a Sheriff's deputy, which left him with a facial disfigurement.

Commissioners - An overlooked renter protection has existed since the 1990's in Palo Alto. It is found in our Municipal Code.

It sets a MINIMUM of 2 people per bedroom that a rental property owner may require. Note that it does NOT set a maximum number.

So, for example in a 2 bedroom apartment, an owner cannot require fewer than 4 occupants, though they can limit more - that is up to the owner but must be applied equally to all.

In the law, the maximum number allowed before legal overcrowding is found is a lot of people - many more than most rental homeowners here allow. Again, they are able to set limits above 2 people per bedroom but not below.

Here is the relevant Muni Code section -

Also - If an owner allows 2 to occupy a studio (they can limit to 1 person), then an adult and child may be that 2. An owner may not limit it to adults only - that would be illegal discrimination and leaves the owner open to a lawsuit.

I hope this is helpful.

Also, suggest involve your counterpart on representative Water's staff, taking note of your comment that YIMBY sentiment is stronger in the east bay whereas the converse, with notable exception of the Avenidas house and Stanford Medical Students housing committees, is yet

prevalent.

See what you think. Suggest a joint task force, representing the above, with yourself as convener Meet virtually and in person to brainstorm taking the above forward

Hundreds of billions were included in president Biden's original initiative, scaled down to the IRA. The interim between the second Biden term and a renewed democratic majority is an ideal time to figure out how to realize president Roosevelt's 1944 and president Truman's goals of raising housing security to the same level as social security, an objective long overdue but realizable with the application of new technology, on the one hand, and tried and true land policies, on the other.

I want to lean in to the point that this is a public safety issue - and leaf blower operators bear the brunt of any public health issues caused by gas-powered leaf blowers. I believe that we can add education about health and safety concerns for the operator to our outreach. Additionally, the operators are often folks with limited economic means, from families of mixed documentation, and may not have the power on their own to buy equipment for themselves or speak up for their health and safety rights at work. So, perhaps partnering with CBOs such as the Day Worker Center of Mountain View and other CBOs in nearby counties could help with this outreach. Thank you for your consideration!

We mourn Tyre Nichols and the cycle of brutality against Black people

The funeral for Tyre Nichols was held
today at Mississippi Boulevard Christian

Church in Memphis, Tennessee. The Rev. Al Sharpton eulogized Mr. Nichols at the memorial, which was also attended by Vice President Kamala Harris, Breonna Taylor's mother Tamika Palmer, and George Floyd's brother Philonise Floyd.

The Equal Justice Society extends our deepest condolences to the Nichols family and loved ones, who should not be grieving the loss of their son, brother, and father.

It is disgusting and horrifying to begin Black History Month with the funeral for yet another unarmed Black person killed by police.

We are sickened by the senseless and endless cycle of police killing Black people, protests, firings, trials, lawsuits, more protests, attempted or cosmetic fixes via police officer trainings, and on and on and on.

Nevertheless, we must keep working, even as this country's history of devaluing the lives of Black people repeats itself. After the May 2020 murder of George Floyd, we understood that the necessary deep and transformative changes would not be easy to achieve. We renewed our commitment to deep transformative change to our public safety system.

Over the past nearly three years since Mr. Floyd's murder, we grew hopeful that the work and movement that his sacrifice would bring the necessary systemic change. But more Black people continue to be brutalized. We have no choice but to persevere against the difficulties, setbacks, distortions, mislabeling, detractors, vilifiers, and incrementalists.

At last week's meeting of the California reparations task force, EJS President Lisa Holder cited the historic [Task Force Interim Report](#) establishing that the criminal legal system is responsible for some of the most egregious state-sanctioned human rights abuses against Black people.

As a member of the reparations task force, Lisa urged strengthening the provisions of The Racial Justice Act, including greater uniformity in its implementation and better data collection and more prosecutorial transparency. She also proposed the creation of a Racial Justice Act Commission to track, audit, monitor and analyze data generated and to increase funding for public oversight so that community organizations can build expertise on racial justice advocacy and compliance.

Lisa serves on this historic reparations task force to shift the narrative on Blackness away from crime and punishment, away from Black bodies being perceived as an immediate danger

and used as the canvas for exacting retribution. The shift must be towards a harm and repair construct, where all state actors acknowledge the harm they have inflicted on Black people, abate the harm, and take action to pay the debt owed and repair the damage to Black lives. In the name of reparatory justice, we call on the police to cease and desist.

The necessary deep and transformative changes will not be easy to achieve. We owe it to Tyre Nichols, George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, Keenan Anderson, and the countless others who have been tragically lost to press on in the fight for a system and future that will bring honor to their memory.
