

Great park! Great clubhouse/info center. Why not replace incandescent lights with compact fluorescents???

Thank you very much for the compliment and very good question.

Most of our lighting is meant to light a specific place (i.e. an exhibit or display) and incandescent lights work best for that purpose. Many of our light fixtures are also bulb specific and can use only one particular light.

Most of our larger spot lights (can or pot style) have been changed to compact fluorescent (CFL) reflectors. The CFL bulb you may be familiar with that looks like a short very squiggly fluorescent tube is mounted inside the reflector bulb housing which makes it appear to be a simple incandescent spot.

When the lights are on (most of the time) it is very hard to tell what they are by looking. Feel free to ask any park personnel to take a peek at one; we keep them in the janitor's closet in the lobby.
