Outdoor Water Use for Non-Residential Customers and Properties

Landscape can be watered two days per week, before 10 a.m. or after 6 p.m. Some exceptions apply.

KNOW YOUR WATERING DAYS

Mondays and Thursdays for odd-numbered addresses and numberless properties, and Tuesdays and Fridays for even-numbered addresses.



EXCEPTIONS:

Functional turf (e.g. playing fields and golf courses)—No limit on irrigation days; irrigate as necessary for health and safety.

Non-functional turf—Irrigation is prohibited entirely unless to protect the health of trees or perennial plants (non-turf), or to address an immediate health and safety need.

Ornamental landscape*—Irrigation is allowed two days per week by irrigation zone, if applicable. Additional irrigation is allowed to protect the health of trees or perennial plants (non-turf), or to address an immediate health and safety need.

Recycled water—no limits on irrigation.

* "Ornamental landscape" refers to landscaping for purely decorative purposes, which is distinguished from trees, edible gardens or landscapes that are functional as well as aesthetic.

Indoor Water Use for Non-Residential Customers and Properties



Restaurants and other food service operations shall serve water to customers only upon request.



Operators of hotels and motels shall provide guests with the option of choosing not to have towels and linens laundered daily.

Free Services and Rebate Programs For Efficient Water Use

Large Landscape Program—Eligible properties greater than a half-acre can schedule a free landscape field survey to receive irrigation efficiency recommendations.

Commercial & Facility Rebates—Includes water-efficiency technology rebates for upgrading equipment in facilities and submeter rebates for residential properties including Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs).

Landscape Rebate Program—Offers rebates to convert lawns and pools to low water use landscape, upgrading existing irrigation equipment to high-efficiency irrigation equipment, and to install rainwater capture systems like rain barrels and more.

Programs and services are provided by Palo Alto's partner in water conservation, Valley Water.
