Interested in nonprofit fund development, special events, and membership programs?

Join the Palo Alto Art Center Foundation team for a graduate-level fellowship dedicated to the development process. The Foundation expands the reach and impact of the Palo Alto Art Center through fundraising and advocacy. To achieve this goal the Foundation maintains an active membership base and donor database and hosts frequent events for cultivation and stewardship purposes. The fellow will gain insight into the steps of the development process at a vibrant arts institution, while assisting with special events, membership communications, research, and database maintenance.

In this role, you will...

- Conduct research regarding museum membership, event, and other development programs
- Become acquainted with the Art Center's programs, in order to understand the fundraising needs
- Assist with daily operational activities, including Salesforce database maintenance and communications
- Work with staff on membership and donor marketing campaigns
- Assist staff with donor recognition efforts and cultivation events
- Help with planning and executing special events and membership activities, including attending planning meetings and day of coordination assistance
- Prospect research for new grant opportunities
- Filing, mailings, and administrative assistance as needed
- Receive mentorship from the Art Center's Director of Development and join a nimble fundraising team, experienced with fundraising in Silicon Valley

- Interested in the art making processes, contemporary art practices, and art engagement strategies
- Excellent organizational, written communication, editorial, and computer skills
